Prayer Focus Update Thursday 13th May

As you will know from the News, the situation in India continues to worsen Nurses and Doctors are committing suicide as they cannot cope with the situation and there is a great sense of hopelessness. People feel there is no governance or plan as the hospitals continue to run out of oxygen. There are public appeals for ICU beds at any price and black market oxygen reportedly available. Reports from praying Christians in India: "We can see the hint of light and know this dark night will end". Another saw "blessings come down as a cloud of prayers ascended." "There is a sense that God is doing something but we can't see what.

Blessons flight was cancelled at 7.30am on Monday, the day he was due to travel, so didn't have to go to S India. Everyone seeing it as an answer to prayer for protection over the family.

The son of a General (we will call him M) military Christian leader, who we prayed for last week has sadly died. This has shaken the military Christian community in that area of India as well as M's church community. They believed in faith that when a bed was found the son would recover. Please pray for M as he deals with his loss while people watch him to see if his faith survives and asking him how he explains it.

Pray for the government and leaders of each state. Government ministers are not being seen or heard. leaving everything to local leaders. The government is refusing to accept help from Christian organizations including oxygen and ventilators as they fear the impact that would have politically. "We need your prayers - keep praying" Many thanks,

Life School

I mentioned last week that the vision growing in me, over the last year, is that we draw the many different activities, the services, the encounters with others, everything! and place it all under the umbrella of living as a community of faith, fulfilling the ultimate commandment to love God, and to love our neighbour as we love ourselves, (Matthew 22) and that everything we do (whether it is in the area of worship, hospitality, or conversation, or help, or reading, or preaching) we do in the spirit of serving the Lord, and learning his ways, growing in faith, to see the Kingdom of God come to Grayshott.

The impact of this will be that we are all excited about finding out what the Lord is leading us to be and do, and we develop a goal of reaching out, inviting, explaining, and leading people to Jesus, so that they can come to the Father through him. Through this we will achieve a unity of purpose, and a community identity, so that anyone who meets someone from St Luke's will have the same sense that we are a community that knows what we are here for. Does this mean that we are forcing our ideas or perspectives on others? NO! But that we are motivated to share what we know we have with others.

We all stand on the brink of coming out of the Covid restrictions, and the question we all face is: how do we do that well? People are asking about the lessons that society has learned from Covid, and whether we will remember them? What I see, is that we at St Luke's have suspended activities and they are all hanging in the air, and we are wondering how they will land, a bit like a Tetris puzzle where the key is to manage where pieces land, so they all fit together, and how new ideas will find their place in the big picture. It may of course also be that some of the things we did before we can 'retire'.

Part of this vision for coming out of Lockdown, is to have a review of homegroups, and other means of support, introducing courses for newcomers such as Alpha, and looking at how we create a pathway for people coming into the Church for the first time. I am enormously grateful for all the support I am receiving, and the PCC is working through some of the practical implications of how we do this.

As we look forward to a bright future, I am trusting that what the Lord plans, he also provides for. Financial support is part of the picture, and we also need to have the right people in the right places with the right skills, So one need is the formation, and leadership of a fundraising group to coordinate funding applications, and encourage activities that will help us to keep on top of the supply. All who give to the Church, are investing in the Kingdom of God. Please pray about where you fit into this picture.
