

Prodigal Son— Craft Activity 1

For the younger children - Day 2

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

A4 White paper

Felt tip pencils

Scissors

Paper clips

Pritt stick/PVA glue

Template of arms/feet and face on St.

Luke's website



HOW TO MAKE THE PRODIGAL SON

Watch the video and read the instructions below:

1. Roll an A4 piece of paper (short side to short side.) Secure the ends with paper clips top and bottom. This will be the body of the Prodigal Son.
2. Flatten the tube and decorate it with the felt tip coloured pens to make a colourful design for the son's tunic including a belt. Now remove the paper clips and glue the length of the tube, as shown on the video.
3. Now cut out the arms/feet and head. Colour in the feet to show his sandals, and the arms to match his tunic.
4. Glue on the arms at the top of the tube and trim the extra bits as shown in the video. Add the head and feet and then stand the Prodigal son. (To make him more stable you can insert a tube from a kitchen roll or similar.)
