For the older children— Day 2

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

A4 White paper

Felt tip pens Pencil

Scissors 2 Lollipop sticks

Ruler

Pritt stick/PVA glue

Template of arms/feet and face on St.
Luke's website



HOW TO MAKE THE PRODIGAL SON'S FATHER

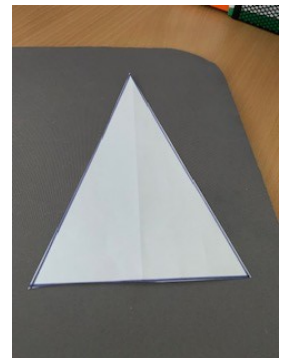
Watch the video and read the instructions below:

1. Fold the A4 piece of paper in half long ways. Cut in half as shown on the video.

(Put one piece to one side to use later.)

2. Take the other piece and fold it from top to bottom and again cut in half.

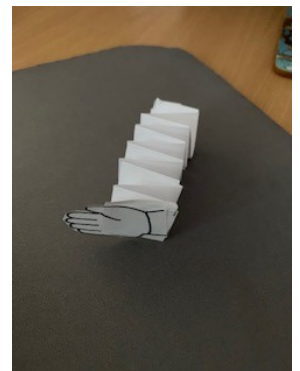
3. Measure the short side at the top and mark it in the middle. Approx 5 cm. Draw two lines from the mark down to the bottom corners making a triangle shape. Cut out the triangle, which will make the Father's tunic.



4. Decorate the triangle with the felt tip pens to make a colourful design.

5. Take the other long A4 piece of paper that you put to one side and measure 4 x 2cm strips lengthways for the arms.

6. Take two of the strips and glue the one end to the other to make an 'L' shape. Bend 1 piece over the other and press down and repeat until you get to the end and then glue the final fold. This will make the concertina arms. Repeat with the other two strips,



6. Now cut out the hands/head and feet from the template and colour them in with the felt tip pens.
7. Glue the hands with thumbs at the top to the concertina arms and then glue them to the triangle body.
8. Next glue the head and feet to the body.
9. Finally glue the two lollipop sticks together to make a long stick and glue this to the back of the Father so that it supports the head. You have now completed the craft.
