

# 3D Sheep Instructions for younger children

## (Story of the Lost Sheep—Day 1

### WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Empty Kitchen roll    Cotton Wool  
Two lolly pop sticks    Black card  
Googly eyes            Scissors  
PVA Glue                Pencil    Black felt tip  
Template of ears and face on St. Luke's website



### HOW TO MAKE THE 3D SHEEP

Watch the video and read the instructions below:

1. Using the template to cut out the face and ears of the sheep in black card. Using PVA glue — stick the ears to the face as shown on the video. Glue on the googly eyes

2. If using an empty kitchen roll cut it to measure about 5" or 13 cm long and then cut it along the length as shown in photo. If you don't have an empty Kitchen roll you can always use cardboard from a cereal box and then bend it to shape. You can hold it in place with an elastic band until it stays in shape.



3. On one end of the tube make cuts about 1/4" or 1 cm around the edge about 1/4" or 1 cm apart and bend them inwards as shown in photo.



4. Cut the lolly pop sticks in half. These will be the sheep's legs. (**You can ask an adult to do this**) You can colour them black with a felt tip pen to match the face and ears. Glue them to the inside of the tube so that they are all the same length and the tube stands up.

5. Cover the tube with glue and add the cotton wool leaving the end you have made the slits in ready to add the face and ears.

6. Apply glue on the end where you have made the cuts and add the face.

Your 3D sheep should now be finished. You can watch the video lots of times to make sure you follow each step.
